The other nice experience from yesterday was tapping into the husband I know, the one that talks to you as a mate; as the one who is closed book at the end of a day is not easy to support.

We were pushed for time when collecting hay as we had to do the rounds of feeding once we arrived home but we thought we would send a photo which will remain a special one to us.

At the end of our round of feeding we discovered a cow stuck in a dam just on dark, thankfully my Dad's tractor was nearby and we were able to pull her out. This morning I found her young calf dead and the cow will need to be put down as she is unable to recover.
